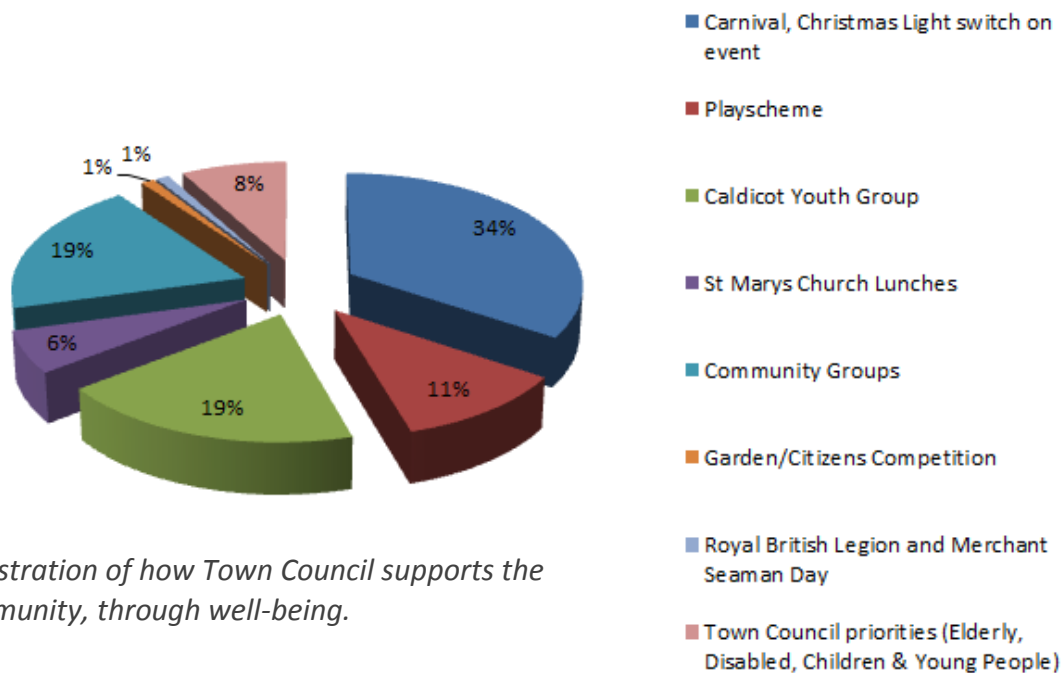
TOWN COUNCIL REDUCES PRECEPT

Caldicot Town Council held a meeting on 27th November 2019 and agreed to reduce the Precept for the next financial year, 2020/2021.

Cllr David Evans, Mayor, Caldicot Town Council said: *“This decrease has been passed on to Monmouthshire County Council and will be considered when Council Tax demands are issued. The reduction represents an average charge of £97.18 per Band D household, this achieves a 1% saving per household compared to 2019/20.”*

Community Well-being

¹ Illustration of how Town Council supports the community, through well-being.

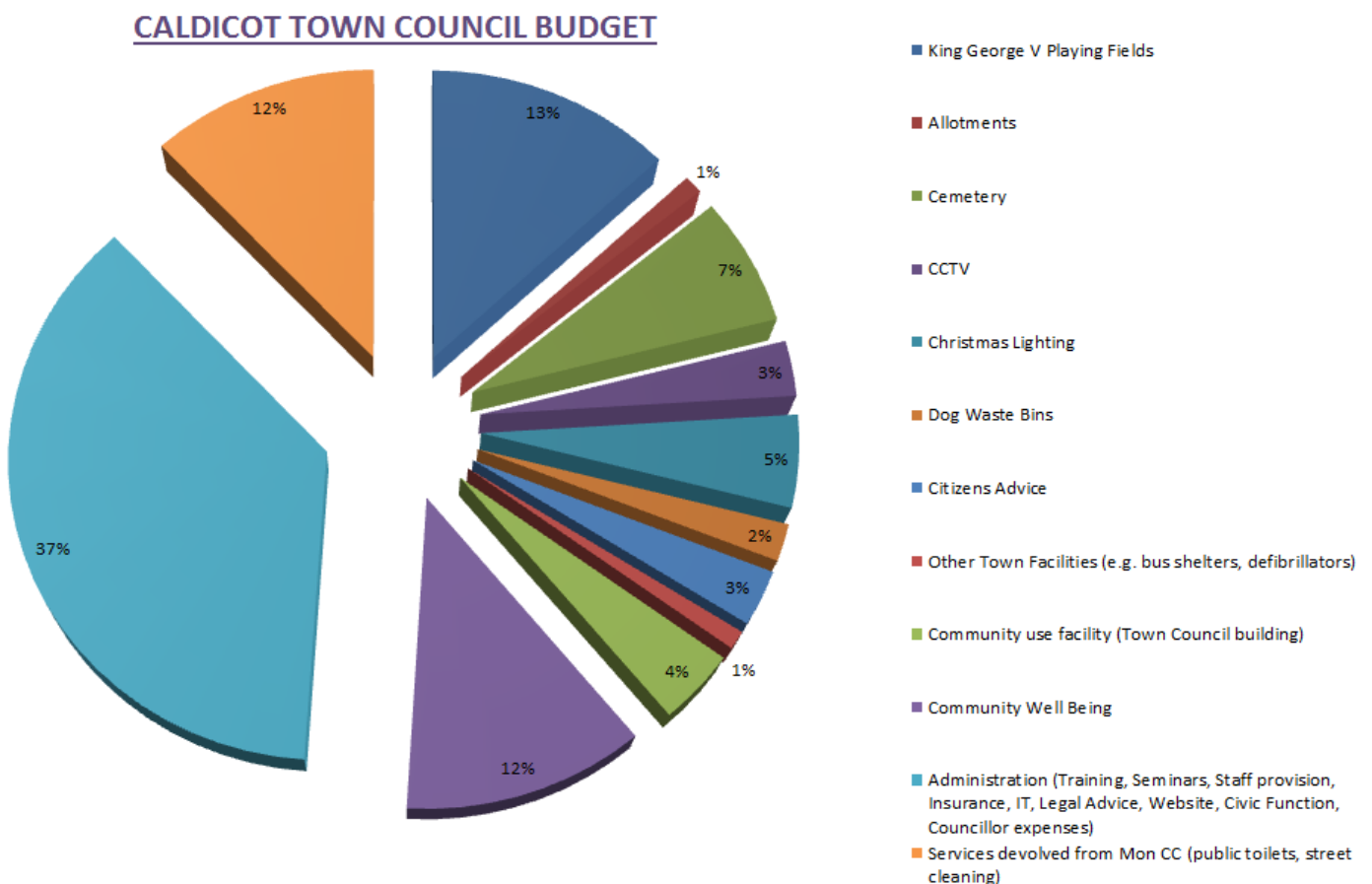
Engagement and Community Relationships
